Our Soil Grows People

The Ferrell Ranch Apprentice Program is designed to inspire graduates to transform agriculture by adhering to the "triple bottom line": people, planet, and prosperity

- **Society (People):** We emphasize the personal and professional growth of each apprentice. We encourage the awakening of each student's innate knowledge.
- **Ecology (Planet):** 4L Grazing leverages our experience and the expertise of our broad network to bring the best of regenerative practices to the Ferrell Ranch
- Economy (Prosperity): We lead with transparency by sharing our holistic decision-making process with every student



Our eight-month program was created to give apprentices a hands-on introduction to regenerative agriculture

- 4L Grazing is the operating company that manages the Ferrell Ranch. The company oversees a diversified portfolio of enterprises including cattle, goats, sheep, poultry and custom grazing. We no longer have bison or Corrientes on the ranch.
- We prioritize the experiential education of the apprentice providing staff who regard themselves as mentors.
- This interactive experience highlights holistic management techniques, personal mission development, and individual coaching to elevate self-efficacy.
- The 7100-acre Ferrell Ranch is in the Flint Hills of Kansas which is the largest tract of intact Tallgrass Prairie in North America: https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Flint Hills. We are near the small town of Beaumont (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Beaumont, Kansas) which is 50 miles east of Wichita, the largest city in the state.

Our Ranch is An Educational Ecosystem

We provide experiential learning designed to elevate the competence and confidence of the apprentice

Educational Components

- PCM (Process Communication Model) assessment and use
- An introduction to WOTB (Working On The Business)
- Exposure to economic and financial planning
- Participation in weekly operational meetings
- Implementation of holistic planned grazing
- Training in low-stress livestock handling
- Basic manual skills

Potential Program Outcomes

Our Soil Grows People will enhance the natural abilities of the apprentice so that they have the potential of a career in ranching

- The apprentice will have an elevated understanding of self-efficacy
- The apprentice will gain a basic understanding of successful ranching strategies
- The apprentice will have a basic understanding of the economics and finance of ranching
- The apprentice will gain the practical manual skills needed for employment in ranching
- The apprentice will have gained crucial skills in leadership and team building
